

Thank you for your interest in vaulting! The following is a description of the major costs associated with vaulting. Equestrian sports are expensive relative to other sports, but vaulting is less expensive than many other equestrian activities.

Instruction:

Instruction on barrel and on the horse. We focus on vaulting compulsories, freestyle, individual routines and team vaulting. Classes run 75-90 minutes. We usually request vaulters commit to a full 6 or 8 week session.

Group instruction, all levels: \$40/per class, or \$210/6-week session, \$280/8-week session

Private/Semi Private Coaching *TBD*

Please make arrangements with the coach. Private/semi private coaching is recommended in advance of competition.

Annual Dues:

Dues pay for horses and related horse expenses, tack, and some clinic fees. PLEASE NOTE: *New vaulters do not pay any dues for the first six months.* Dues do not cover all expenses, so the club also engages in fundraising activities. Members are asked to participate in fundraising – we estimate the typical commitment is about 15-20 hours a year. Thank you!

Recreational vaulting: \$250

Available to vaulters interested in drop-in instruction or occasional sessions, first-year or beginning vaulters not sure if they want to compete, and to adult vaulters interested in vaulting as a way to strengthen riding skills.

Competitive Vaulting Walk/Trot: \$325 Canter:\$500

Friends and Alumnae/alumni \$150

If you have more than one vaulter per family, please ask about our sibling discount.

Equipment:

We recommend vaulters purchase a pair of vaulting shoes (approximately \$30). Competitive vaulters will also need a team unitard (about \$110). NEV team unitards are available at Grettawear. Links for both Pegasus (shoes) and Grettawear are on the home page.

Other equipment needed usually involves tack/horse equipment. Dues cover the costs of tack.

Other:

Competitive vaulters incur competition/travel fees, including coaching fees and coach's travel.

Affordability:

NEV offers some limited opportunities to exchange taking on club jobs in exchange for an offset to dues or lesson fees. Please ask. A limited amount of scholarship money may also be also available.
